1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Al Cain called the meeting of the Colleyville Library Board to order at 6:03 p.m.

Present: Chair Al Cain, and Board members: Wanda Cotter, Kay Newton, Molly Skinner, Joseph Stout, Darrell Brown, David Thach, Merry Graves. City staff: Library Director Jack Pawlowski and Library Outreach and Program Coordinator Dina Bayles.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

April 14, 2025

A motion was made by Kay Newton and seconded by Molly Skinner to approve the April 14, 2025 minutes. The motion was approved unanimously.

3. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS

3a Overview of the Makerspace Project

Jack Pawlowski introduced the plans for the Maker Space; a dedicated space with laser engravers, sewing machines, and 3D Printers. Director Pawlowski explained that the project began in November as a potential off-site location however the cost feasibility was not there. The Maker Space project was in cooperated within the existing Library which was more cost effective. The construction started in early June and is set to be completed by August or September. Director Pawlowski stated how the audiovisual collection was relocated throughout the first floor to make room for the Make Space. More details on day to day operations, policies, and procedures would be established closer to the opening of the space which is projected for the month of December.

3b Update on the Collection Development Policy

Director Pawlowski discussed the Collection Development Policy review and revisions were on pause to see if any bills from the 89th Texas Legislature have any impact

on the policy. Since nothing came into passing, collection Development Policy re-evaluation will resume and should be complete by August.

3c Update on Digital Content Platforms

Boundless, funded by the State Library as part of E-Read Texas, will continue as a platform for 2026 calendar year and new content will be added quarterly. Hoopla is the new digital platform being added, which includes e-books, e-audiobooks, comics, music, movies, and television shows. A soft launch would start on Monday, June 16, and a wide spread promotion of the service would start in July.

3d Discussion of Items for Future Agendas

Wanda Cotter requested a new member list via email or hard copy.

4. REPORTS

4a Librarian's Report

A. Monthly Statistics

Director Pawlowski noted the circulation statistics were strong, while program attendance was down in May due to limited school visits. School visits being restricted due to school safety/security concerns. Remote locker usage up to 50-100 transactions per month as opposed to the average 30 per month. The restaurant gift card promotion increased its usage during that time and the statistics have remained high since that campaign. Increased traffic in the Rec Center has helped usage as well. Voting number still skewing patrons visiting the library numbers, but overall statistics are good minus voting outlier.

B. Donations

The library received a donation of \$500 from Friends of the Library for summer reading prizes. Gift cards have been purchased utilizing these funds for the Adult and Teen programs.

C. Library Programs

Summer Reading Kick-off saw 180 kids claiming their first prizes at the party, and 525 patrons using the Library in two hours. 1,026 people as of this meeting participating in the Summer Reading Challenge: 157 adults and 17 teens already participating, and 852 kids registered for the reading challenge.

4b Friends of the Colleyville Public Library Report

Merry Graves reported that there are 21 members and invited the board to join. Donations continue to be accepted and donated items are still being sold inside the Library as well as online to Better World Books and Thrift Books. The Friends will be selling ice cream on Thursday after performer programs. Some of the donated and withdrawn books were given to Ellery Arbor Memory Care to support their book exchange and in-house Library for residents and families. Annual Friends meeting is tomorrow, with Dina Bayles presenting Library initiatives regarding Memory Care Fidget Mats and Memory Care Kits. Family service project day is on Saturday with sewing and attaching fidget items to come in the near future.

4c Colleyville Public Library Foundation Report

No Foundation members present.

5. ADJOURNMENT

A motion was made by Wanda Cotter and seconded by Kay Newton to adjourn the meeting of the Colleyville Library Board at 6:39 p.m. The motion was approved unanimously.

Collection Development Policy

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of the library selection process is to acquire physical and digital materials for the Colleyville Public Library while working within the budgetary constraints. This policy presents the guidelines followed by the Library and explains the criteria staff use to add or withdraw materials from the collection.

Responsibility for Selection

Ultimate responsibility for material selected rests with the Library Director who operates within this framework which has been reviewed by the City Attorney and approved by the Library Advisory Board. The Library Director delegates the task of collection development to professional staff.

Objectives and Scope

The foundation of any public library is a broad and varied collection of information resources including print, media and electronic resources, which meet the educational, informational, recreational, and cultural needs of the community it serves. The Colleyville Public Library was established to serve everyone within the Library's service area and recognizes individuals and groups within the community have diverse interests, backgrounds, and needs.

Philosophy of Selection

Colleyville Public Library utilizes the Library Bill of Rights and the Freedom to Read Statement, created by the American Library Association, as a foundation for public library services and as a guide to best practices. The collection development goals are:

- To provide quality recreational reading materials for children, teens, and adults, with emphasis on current and high-demand materials, in a variety of formats.
- To provide materials that will stimulate growth in factual knowledge, literary appreciation, aesthetic values, and ethical standards in a pluralistic society.
- To provide a background of information which will enable patrons to make intelligent judgments in their daily lives.
- To provide materials on opposing sides of controversial issues so that no one viewpoint is unduly represented.

- To place principle above personal opinion and reason above prejudice in the selection of materials of the highest quality in order to assure a comprehensive collection appropriate for the users.

Selection Criteria

Selection of materials is driven by popular demand, quality, accuracy, authority, timeliness, enduring value, social significance, cost and availability of material on the topic. Materials are judged on the basis of the content and style of the work as a whole. Library materials are selected for the general reader rather than the specialist. Items do not need to meet all criteria to be selected, nor does fulfillment of criteria necessarily guarantee selection. Material selection criteria includes, but is not limited to:

- Reviews from professional library resources/journals
- Authoritativeness and/or reputation of the author
- Relevance to interests and needs of the community
- Price, availability, and Library materials budget
- Extent of publicity, critical review, and current or anticipated demand
- Currency and accuracy of information
- Level of need within the existing collection
- Impartiality or absence of bias
- Aesthetic qualities or literary merit
- Technical aspects such as illustrations, sound, and clarity

Materials are selected for the Library using a variety of sources, including professional journals, trade journals, subject and genre bibliographies, publisher catalogs, reviews in the popular press, and suggestions from patrons. Self-published titles will be evaluated using the same criteria as titles published by a publishing house. Items donated to the Library or the Friends of the Colleyville Public Library may be selected for inclusion in the collection if the professional staff determine it meets criteria for selection and is in good condition.

Digital Resources

Digital resources fall into two classes: Owned materials and accessed materials. Owned or purchased material is selected by librarians and will fall under "Selection Criteria". Accessed material will undergo additional considerations including:

- Price
- Ease of Use / Accessibility of platform

- Accessibility to patrons (in-house use and /or remote access; 24/7 access)
- Availability from contracted vendors
- Need or interest from the community
- Terms of licensing agreements
- Cost per use analysis

Many accessed digital resources are curated by third-party sources, and as such the IPL does not control the content. Digital resources are evaluated annually to determine ongoing need for the collection.

Collection Maintenance and Repair

Items in the Library are subject to damage. Through aging and use, the body of the material may be unable to support being loaned to patrons for their use although the information contained in the material is still valuable to the collection.

Items identified as damaged will be repaired by trained staff if the item is deemed necessary to the collection by the professional staff. If the damage is irreparable, staff will attempt to replace the item. If evaluated as not necessary to the collection, or damaged or aged beyond reasonable repair, the item will be deselected from the collection.

Deselection (Weeding) of Materials

The practice of maintaining the integrity of the materials collections of the Colleyville Public Library through systematic evaluation, deselection, and withdrawing of materials (both print and electronic) is critical for collection development and maintenance. The Library uses the professional practices described in the publication, *CREW: A Weeding Manual for Modern Libraries*. The decision to either retain or withdraw items from the collection will be based on, but not limited to, the following factors:

- Frequency of circulation
- Overall physical condition of the item
- Age of the information contained in the item
- Relevance or usefulness to the collection
- Current or anticipated demand by patrons.

Items discarded are plainly marked and may be donated to the Friends of the Colleyville Public Library for sale.

Intellectual Freedom and Request for Reconsideration of Material

The Library takes no side on public issues and does not attempt to promote any beliefs or points of view through its collection. The Library does not endorse the opinions expressed in the materials held. Library patrons are free to choose what they want from the collections but are not to restrict the freedom of others to choose. In selecting materials for the collection, Library staff will not be inhibited by the possibility that materials may come into a child's possession, and the Library does not restrict materials that can be borrowed by any age group. Parents or legal guardians have the sole responsibility to guide and direct the materials their own minor children access. Library staff does not serve in loco parentis.

The Colleyville Public Library welcomes input from Library patrons concerning materials selected for the collection. If a patron questions the appropriateness of an item in the collection, they should first address their concern to the professional librarian responsible for the collection. If the patron is a resident of Colleyville, has a valid Colleyville Public Library card, has read the work in its entirety, and wishes to pursue a formal request for reconsideration, the following procedure will be followed:

1. The patron will be supplied with a Request for Reconsideration of Library Materials form and a copy of the Library's Collection Development Policy. The completed form can be returned to the Library Director. A form not completed in its entirety may not be eligible for review.
2. The Library Director, or designee, will respond to the patron in writing within 7 days to acknowledge receipt of the Request for Reconsideration of Library Materials form and outline steps that will be taken by Library staff.
3. The Library Director and another professional librarian will independently evaluate the material to ensure that it meets the selection and evaluation criteria outlined in the policy. They will meet to determine if the reconsideration will be accepted within 30 days of the Library's acknowledgement of the request. During this time, the material will still be available to Library patrons.
4. When a decision is made, the patron will be notified of the decision. The Library Board and Colleyville City administration will also be notified of the decision.

The Library will allow for the decision to be appealed one time. The patron may appeal the decision of the Library in writing within 14 days of being notified of the decision. Upon receipt of the appeal, the Library Director will appoint a committee

comprised of the Library Director, a representative from the City Manager's Office, one Library Advisory Board member, a City Councilmember and the Mayor. The Library Advisory Board member will be selected at random from a pool of volunteers. They will meet to determine if the reconsideration will be accepted within 30 days. During this time, the material will still be available to Library patrons. When a decision is made, the patron will be notified by letter of the decision. The Library Board and the Colleyville City administration will also be notified of the final decision.

After a decision is made, the Library will not review subsequent requests for reconsideration for the same material for a period of two years.
