President Bobby Lindamood called the Colleyville Crime Control and Prevention District Board of Directors Worksession to order at 5:00 p.m. on June 17, 2025, and called the roll.

President Lindamood read Resolution R-25-0102 in its entirety.

There were no questions and President Lindamood opened and closed the public hearing without any speakers.

Vice President Elder made a motion to approve Resolution R-25-0102, seconded by Director Graves.

3. RESOLUTION(S): READING AND PUBLIC HEARING

3a Resolution R-25-0103

Approval of the Fiscal Year 2026 Colleyville Crime Control and Prevention District Budget

Assistant Police Chief Hillary Wreay reviewed the CCCPD history and the FY2026 budget noting there is one new funding request being sought, a full-time Network and Cybersecurity Administrator reporting to the Information Systems Management department. She stated annual funding of \$54,869 is requested from CCCPD and \$54,869 from the Utility Fund. Chief Wreay noted it is an unfortunate common occurrence to hear about a city, county, or business being targeted in a cyber-attack. Additionally, agencies across the nation have new federal security requirements to meet by October 1, 2027.

The ongoing initiatives provided for in the FY26 budget include funding of salary and benefits for 17 full time, sworn officer positions, five of which are School Resource Officer positions, a part-time Accreditation Coordinator, two part-time Public Service Officers positions, Records Management System software (CentralSquare) and maintenance, various software maintenance agreements, and participation in the Metroport Teen Court Program. Chief Wreay stated the budget also includes funding Police Department vehicles, weapons replacement, safety equipment, training, SWAT, Early Warning System/Internal Affairs System Annual Subscription, and the license plate reader camera annual licensing costs.

Assistant City Manager Mark Wood reviewed the budget with the Board. He stated the Board asked if there were any options beyond the current compensation plan for FY26. Manager Wood presented three options for applying an additional \$50,000 beyond the most recently approved compensation plan; 1) apply amount to Officer entry salaries for pay compression; 2) apply amount as a one-time flat amount (bonus); and 3) apply amount as a one-time amount based on performance (bonus).

There was discussion regarding the compensation study, the number of employees of the City, the market for police officers, officer pay in the surrounding cities, national turnover averages, and the Board's desire to minimize the compression within the police department. The CCCPD budget and General Fund budget were discussed and reviewed.

President Lindamood opened and closed the public hearing without any speakers.

President Lindamood made a motion to utilize \$50,000 from the CCCPD FY26 budget to apply to entry officer pay and address compression, to amend the budget resolution to reflect projected revenues at \$3,790,000, and expenditures at \$3,162,684, seconded by Director Graves.

The motion carried by the following vote:

Ayes: 7 – President Lindamood, Vice President Elder, and Directors Alphonso, Richardson, Graves, Holt Gunderson, and Raine.

3b Resolution R-25-0104

Election of a President and Vice President of the Colleyville Crime Control and Prevention District Board of Directors

President Lindamood read Resolution R-25-0104 in its entirety.

President Lindamood opened and closed the public hearing without any speakers.

President Lindamood made a motion to appoint Director Bobby Lindamood as president, and Director Brandi Elder as Vice President of the CCCPD Board for the ensuring one year term, seconded by Director Alphonso.

1. CALL TO ORDER

President Bobby Lindamood called the Colleyville Crime Control and Prevention District Board of Directors Worksession to order at 5:00 p.m. on June 2, 2026, and called the roll.

ROLL CALL: President Bobby Lindamood, and Directors Brandi Elder, Mark Alphonso, Scotty Richardson, Ben Graves, Kimberly Holt Gunderson, and Tim Raine.

ALSO PRESENT: Assistant Police Chief Hillary Wreay, Assistant City Manager Adrienne Lothery, Assistant City Manager Mark Wood, Finance Director Cassie Smith, and City Secretary Christine Loven.

2. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION

2a Discussion of the Colleyville Crime Control and Prevention District (CCCPD) Fiscal Year 2027 budget

Assistant Police Chief Hillary Wreay reviewed the history of the CCCPD and noted the District was renewed for an additional 20 years in May 2023, and will be eligible for renewal again in 2043. She then reviewed the FY26 initiatives and progress.

Chief Wreay reviewed the new funding requests for FY27 which include the taser replacement program at a total cost of \$236,938.80, to be funded over five years and the police motorcycle replacement program which if approved, would fund the replacement of two 2019 Harley Davidson motorcycles with two new Harley Davidsons or BMWs at a total cost of approximately \$100,000.

The ongoing initiatives provided for in the FY26 budget include funding of salary and benefits for 19 full time, sworn officer positions, six of which are School Resource Officer positions, a part-time Accreditation Coordinator, two part-time Public Service Officers positions, funding for half the Network and Cybersecurity Administrator, Records Management System software (CentralSquare), various software maintenance agreements, and participation in the Metroport Teen Court Program. Chief Wreay stated the budget also includes funding Police Department

vehicles, weapons replacement, safety equipment, training, SWAT, Early Warning System/Internal Affairs System Annual Subscription, and the license plate reader cameras annual licensing costs.

Chief Wreay then asked Finance Director Cassie Smith to review the proposed budget. Director Smith provided a year-to-year comparison and reviewed all general categories of the proposed FY27 budget.

There was discussion of the tasers and Chief Wreay noted the cost includes trade-in value of the current, obsolete tasers. Additional discussion regarding the SRO salaries and benefits line item and the expectation to see a reduction in the line item as there is one less elementary school to provide for ensued. Finance Director Cassie Smith stated there would be an adjustment in the proposed budget at the Board Meeting on June 16, 2026, where the Board will vote.

3. ADJOURNMENT

President Lindamood thanked the Board, Chief Wreay, and Director Smith.

There being no further business before the Board, President Lindamood adjourned the meeting at 5:19 p.m.

Approval of the Fiscal Year 2027 Colleyville Crime Control and Prevention District Budget

Explanation

Reading and Public Hearing

In accordance with the Local Government Code, the Colleyville Crime Control and Prevention District (CCCPD) Board, which is comprised of the City Council, must hold a public hearing on the proposed annual budget at least 100 days before the start of the fiscal year and adopt a budget at least 80 days before the start of the fiscal year.

During the discussion of the FY2027 proposed CCCPD budget on June 2, 2026, staff presented a complete FY2027 budget proposal and a five-year forecast based on current information. No changes to the FY2027 proposed CCCPD budget were requested. Staff is seeking Board approval of the proposed FY2027 expenditures. Upon Board approval, the CCCPD budget must be submitted to the City Council for consideration.

There is currently an item scheduled for the July 7, 2026, City Council meeting agenda to allow for City Council consideration, should the Board approve the FY2027 CCCPD budget at this meeting.

ADOPTING AN ANNUAL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2027 FOR THE COLLEYVILLE CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT

Discussion of Proposed FY 2027 Colleyville Crime Control Prevention District Budget (CCCPD)

Creation & Authorization

- The CCCPD was first established in 1999 by local voters for an initial five year period. Voters renewed the District for an additional 20 years in 2003
- In 2023, voters renewed the District for an additional 20 year period
- The District will be eligible for renewal again in 2043

District Powers

- Local Government Code Chapter 363, Section 363.151

“The district may finance all the costs of a crime control and crime prevention program, including the costs for personnel, administration, expansion, enhancement, and capital expenditures.”

Updates on Initiatives from Previous FYs

Partial Funding for Full-time Network & Cybersecurity Administrator:

- The employee (Julian Smith) was hired into the position last year and is reporting to the Information Systems Management department
 - Annual funding of \$54,869 is provided from CCCPD
 - Additional \$54,869 is provided via the Utility Fund
- This role provided immediate and on-going federal security requirement realignment including citywide IT cybersecurity, network infrastructure, and utility enhancements.

New Funding Request for FY27

Taser Replacement Program

- CPD purchased the current Taser model X26P in 2019
- Vendor indicated the model is approaching end of life (loss of cartridge availability, replacement handles, and software/firmware updates)
- No competitor on the market currently
- Propose to purchase 51 new Taser model 10's for **\$236,938.80**
- We can spread the total cost over 5 years with no interest which would be **\$47,387.16 per year** (approximately \$929.16 per unit / year)
- 5-year warranty – no renewal available
- Includes: All single-probe cartridges, replacement handles (if damaged), holsters, 2 Taser training suits, VR training platform, instructor training

Taser Replacement Program

- Taser 10 is capable of firing 10 individual probes (X26P fires 2 probes at once with no reload possible)
- Taser 10 has a minimum range of zero feet making up-close targeting possible (X26P has minimum range of approximately 4 feet)
- Taser 10 has a maximum range of 45 feet (X26P has a maximum range of 15-25 feet)



Police Motorcycle Replacement Program

- CPD purchased the current motorcycles (2) in 2019, and both are due for replacement
- The equipment on these motorcycles are over 10 years old as they were carried over from previous units
- As part of the replacement program, both the motorcycles and all associated emergency equipment should be replaced
- Propose to purchase two (2) Harley Davidson or BMW police motorcycles and equipment for approximately \$50,000 per unit for a total of **\$100,000**
- Actual costs for Harley Davidson (\$43,129 per unit) and for BMW (\$49,511 per unit)

Police Motorcycle Replacement Program

- Utilized by our Traffic Unit with the purpose of reducing traffic related injuries and fatalities
- Traffic enforcement is focused on intersections with the most traffic crashes and complaints
- Unit investigates traffic crashes and hit and runs
- Utilize motorcycles due to increased visibility, accessibility, greater mobility and they are ideal for traffic enforcement and special escorts



Ongoing Initiatives:

- Funding of Salary and Benefits for nineteen (19) full-time sworn officer positions
 - We are currently authorized for 50 sworn city-wide
 - 6 of the 19 are our SRO program
- Funding for a part-time Accreditation Coordinator position
- Funding for 2 part-time Public Service Officer positions
- Funding for half the Network & Cybersecurity Administrator – as approved with the FY26 budget.
- Records Management System software (CentralSquare) and maintenance
- Various software maintenance agreements
- Participation in the Metroport Teen Court Program at one-quarter of the regional costs

Ongoing Initiatives (cont):

- Police Department vehicles primarily funded through CCCPD budget
 - Utilizing Enterprise for all fleet needs city-wide.
- Continuation of weapons replacement schedule
- Funding for SWAT training and equipment. We fill up to 3 slots on the Northeast Tarrant SWAT Team. This line item sets aside funding for all the necessary equipment and training for our members of the team.
- Funding for safety equipment and ongoing replacement, these items include collapsible rubber base traffic cones for each patrol unit
- Funding for Early Warning System / Internal Affairs System Annual Subscription

Ongoing Initiatives (cont):

- License Plate Reader camera annual licensing costs
- Funding for Crime Scene Response
- Funding for annual training for de-escalation / crisis intervention and leadership development training
- Partial funding for a full-time Network & Cybersecurity Administrator

New Initiatives:

- Funding for the Taser replacement program (51)
- Funding for Police motorcycle replacements (2)

RESOLUTION R-26-0107

**APPOINTING A PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT
TO THE COLLEYVILLE CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT
BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

WHEREAS, the Colleyville Crime Control and Prevention District Board of Directors shall elect, from among its members, a President and Vice President in accordance with the Local Government Code.
